Setyawati Fitrianggraeni (Fitri) is a maritime legal practitioner, advisor, and academic whose work centers on civil liability and compensation in maritime law. She is a Listed Arbitrator on the Panel of the Singapore Chamber of Maritime Arbitration (SCMA) and a Supporting Member of the London Maritime Arbitrators Association (LMAA). She is a Fellow of the Chartered Institute of Arbitrators (FCI Arb) and the Asian Institute of Alternative Dispute Resolution (FAIADR).

Focus and Approach

Fitri's practice is built on a specific foundation: the law of civil liability and compensation in the maritime sector, and how it can be designed and applied to serve maritime safety. Across more than twenty years of practice, advisory work, and research, she has concentrated on the questions that determine who bears responsibility when things go wrong at sea, how compensation frameworks operate, and how disputes can be prevented, managed, and resolved.

This focus informs her approach as an arbitrator. She brings to maritime disputes a thorough grounding in the liability and compensation principles at their core, a practitioner's understanding of how maritime operations and risks actually unfold, and a commitment to reasoned, impartial determination.

Indonesian Maritime Law

Academic and Policy Standing

Fitri is a PhD Candidate at the World Maritime University (WMU) in Malmö, an institution established by the International Maritime Organization (IMO). Her doctoral research examines how civil liability and compensation frameworks in maritime law — with particular attention to the carriage of passengers — can be strengthened to better protect both maritime systems and the people they serve. She holds an LLM in Maritime Law from University College London (UCL).

She serves as Assistant Professor of Laws of Obligations at the Faculty of Law, Universitas Indonesia, and supports Indonesia's engagement with the IMO Legal Committee. She is a Certified Legislative Drafter and Legal Auditor, and the founder of Gerakan Ingat Selamat Layar Indonesia (GISLI), a maritime safety initiative working with Indonesian coastal and fishing communities.

Her work is driven by a commitment to dispute prevention and sound risk allocation — resolving complex challenges, where possible, before they escalate into formal disputes, and emphasizing the practical implementation of law to achieve sustainable societal objectives for future generations.
